Twin Cities 14 years old

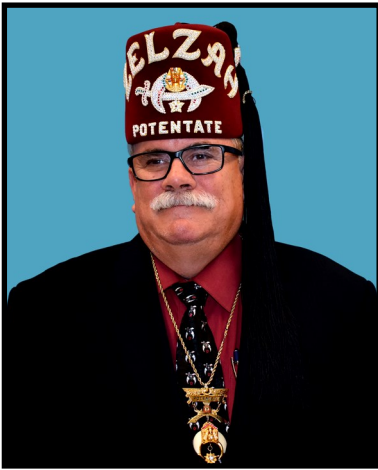

Thoughts from the Assistant Rabban**Alan Wise**

Some of you are already filling leadership roles, while others will assume a leadership role in the not-too-distant future. That role could be in any number of positions, and all of them have one thing in common: leading people.

There are many definitions of leadership, and you've probably learned several during your lifetime. My personal definition comes from a quote I found while reading an issue of Reader's Digest. This definition struck a chord with me and I have shared it with others. The quote reads, "**Leadership is getting your people to do the mission because they want to do it.**" If you think about it, isn't that what it's all about? Getting something accomplished by people who want to accomplish it.

I have found over the years that by using the following five motivational building blocks and my secret weapon, I've been able to get those people I have been tasked to lead to do the mission because they wanted to do it.

The first building block is to ask for performance. In order to do this you must first determine the skills and knowledge of the people you are tasked with leading. Then you must outline your expectations for completing the task. Always ensure you describe the job to be done, explain how the task is to be accomplished and set specific expectations so everyone understands the task and the goal.

The second building block is to use lots of positive reinforcement and personalize it. Don't take acceptable for work for granted. Thank folks for what they do. Most importantly, remember that positive feedback doesn't have to be saved until a formal situation. It can be done anytime, anywhere.

The third building block is to build relationships. Take time to get to know not only the people in your unit or club, but others in the Temple and outside the Temple. Know what they want to do and what motivates them. People respond best when you respect and understand their individuality.

The fourth building block is to model what you want. When you lead by example, people follow. Approach your tasks or the tasks of your unit or club with a sense of urgency, use your time efficiently, and meet your personal goals.

By doing these things, you set a positive example and exhibit those behaviors you desire the people you are leading to emulate. Others will follow your lead.

The fifth building block is to refuse to accept poor performance in yourself and those you have been elected to lead. This can be the hardest building block to implement, but one of the most important. By not accepting poor performance, you demonstrate that quality and performance matter.

The "secret weapon" that makes these work and leads to success: attitude. Having the right attitude, whether you are leading or following sets the tone for success. Without the proper attitude, it is very hard to motivate others. The best expression I've seen about attitude was on the business card of Chief Master Sergeant Dan Garza, one of my mentors during my Air Force career. It read, "**Attitudes are contagious...is yours worth catching?**"

So, what should you do when you find yourself thinking, "How can I motivate my folks to do something because they want to?" First examine yourself and ensure your attitude is one worth catching. Then try these five building blocks.

Medical Center – Pasadena

The following information was provided during the January 2020 Board of Governors (BOG) Meeting held on January 22, 2020.

2019 Accomplishments:

Patient volumes increased by 22 percent.

533 Ambulatory Surgery Cases

9,902 Outpatient Clinic, Outreach/Telehealth and Rehabilitation encounters

165 Inpatient Admissions

Reduced overall Draw on Endowment by \$3.2 million

Raised \$3.43 million

Increased overall giving by 27 percent (+\$980,000 over 2018)

Added 1,128 new donors

Sixth largest producer of clinical research in the Shrine system

The Tijuana Clinic, an ambulatory clinic, has completed its move from its original building to its new facilities on the 5th floor of Hospital Angeles. They now share space with the physical therapy facilities of the hospital. The Tijuana Clinic is responsible for treating children in the Northern Mexico area.

The Medical Center – Pasadena is currently in partnership discussions with the Children’s Hospital of LA.

During the recent 2020 Shriners Hospitals for Children leadership meeting it was established that changes in the operation and management of all hospitals in the system is needed and the leadership has started to work those issues and changes will be coming in the future at all hospitals and medical centers under the Shriners Hospitals for Children program. The leadership also recognized the need for better communications with the temples to provide better information to all Nobles of Shriners International.

Currently international patients are not covered by the Shriners Hospitals for Children services survey program. The company overseeing this survey program is going to be contacted to initiate an upgrade to the survey program so that survey information can be obtained and imputed into the survey for international patients to give us a better review of the services provided by those hospitals and medical centers providing services to international patients.

The Finance Committee is working to simplify and make clear the capital budget to allow temples to determine which budget items a temple can provide fundraising to assist the medical center in obtaining those budgeted items. They are also working to provide a way to substitute different capital hardware when needed so funds raised by temples doesn’t sit idle because the hardware is not on the current 5 Year Capital Budget Plan.

The Medical Center – Pasadena has established a growth goal of 750 cases per year, as well as continuing the current downward trend of the draw on endowment funds.

Finally, April 22, 2020 has been set for the Divan Day program. At a minimum, the medical center would like the elected divan to attend the program. The hospital BOG’s would like each temple to visit the medical center during the week to get an orientation and visit with the children being seen on that day.

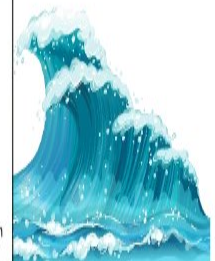
