


Please remember we are still doing onion sales so get your orders in ASAP. Be sure you indicate to give the LOH credit.

Thoughts from the Assistant Rabban

This fraternity of ours is a brotherhood composed of many parts: Masons, York Rite, Scottish Rite, Shriners, Eastern Star and Order of the Amaranth, Inc. Some of these groups have sub groups, but all are part of the whole, this brotherhood which was started so long ago and has stood the test of time. But what is a brotherhood. Brotherhood has several definitions, such as, "all those engaged in a particular trade or profession or sharing a common interest or quality or a fraternal organization." But the definition of brotherhood which I strive to live up to is: "the belief that all people should act with warmth and equality toward one another, regardless of differences in nationality, creed, ethnicity, etc." During these times, we as Masons should be setting an example for others to emulate. Let us practice "brotherly love" in our day to day lives, in the light as in the dark.

In May, we observe Armed Forces Day and Memorial Day. On Armed Forces Day we honor our active duty, reserve and guard armed forces members. If you know or meet a man or woman serving in our armed forces, please take a moment and thank him or her for serving and ensuring our freedom. Memorial Day is a time to give thanks and to remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice to ensure the liberties we so often take for granted in this great country of ours. Let us not think of this day as a day for barbeques, a day off from work or a time just to kick back and relax. Let us lead by example and be the ones who take some time to pay tribute to those men and women, who through their actions through all the generations of this nation have sought by the giving of their lives to ensure that this nation of ours remained secure and free for the next generation. Make sure you pay the right homage to the flag for which they fought and died. And take a moment to honor them in your heart and help your family to understand what these great Americans did for them.

On 14 June, we celebrate Flag Day. What does Flag Day commemorate for the American people. It marks the adoption of the official flag of the United States. This adoption dates back to the Flag Resolution of 1777 which in part declared that "the flag of thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternating red and white, that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." Flag Day began as a local celebration with the first celebration being held in Wisconsin to mark the anniversary of the Flag Resolution of 1777 on June 14. From there more and more communities began to mark this special day in the history of this union. Flag Day was officially established in 1916 by presidential proclamation signed by President Woodrow Wilson. But it was not until 1949, when President Harry Truman signed an act of Congress that June 14 was designated

encouraged to display the flag on that day to celebrate our flag and its heritage. What of the woman, Betsy Ross, the supposed maker of the nation's first flag, it is purported that George Washington entered her shop in Philadelphia on the eve of independence with a sketch of a new flag to represent those first thirteen states of our union. It is said the most memorable moment of that meeting was when looking at the six-pointed stars represented in the sketch, that Betsy folded a piece of paper and with one snip of her scissors produced a perfect five-point star. Her efforts convinced the future president and an important element of our national identity became a fact. Betsy is an important part of our American history, not because she made any one flag, but rather because she was a young American craftswoman who embraced the resistance movement with vigor, helped celebrate its victories and suffered its defeats. Her story is important because it helps us understand the working men and women who helped to build early American cities and industries. And that flag that waves above the White House and every other home and business in this great nation or stands inside a masonic lodge or any other masonic based organization building is a continual reminder of the people, past and present, which helped to make this great country.

In July, we celebrate the birth of the American independence. Why was the 4th of July chosen for this celebration? It was because on that date in 1776 the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence. The first annual commemoration of Independence Day was held in Philadelphia on July 4, 1777 and later Massachusetts became the first state to make the day an official state holiday. In 1870, almost a hundred years after the formal adoption of the Declaration of Independence, Congress made the July 4th a federal holiday. This celebration is marked by family gatherings and patriotic displays such as parades and firework shows. But more importantly it represents the forming of our nation and the development of the American culture and freedoms which have been defended and fought for by generations of Americans. As you celebrate the 4th of July this year, please take a moment to reflect on the culture and freedoms that serve as a beacon of light to so many.



The following information from the February and March 2020 Board of Governors (BOG) Meetings is provided for your review. If you have any questions please contact one of the below listed Zelzah Shrine representatives.

CHAIRMAN AND ADMINISTRATION REMARKS FROM THE FEBRUARY BOG MEETING:

Chairman's Remarks

Chairman Kupka thanked our Board of Trustee Liaison, Imperial Sir Costello, for being present at this meeting. He continued with comments to the Medical Center moving in the right direction; the Tijuana Clinic move enhances our services deliveries and anticipates improved processes and patient experiences to our patient population in Northern Mexico. He also mentioned that Shriners signage and Silent Messenger are expected to be in place over the upcoming weeks.

Administration (Hospital Leadership)

The Medical Center's overarching 2019 year-end scorecard was reviewed and discussed. Administrator Dougherty highlighted that we exceeded our targeted goals in our primary key performance indicators. It was also reported that we have been successful in our appeal in getting an exemption on the property taxes and have already received refunds (not 100%) for 2016 and 2017.

The Tijuana Clinic volumes report was presented --- numbers continue to rise. An update was given as to Tijuana's post-move and settling into operations at the new facility. All indicators points to operations being fluid and patients/patient families being delighted with the new location. Patty indicated that Hospital Angeles views Shriners as an excellent partner. Our affiliation with HIC continues.

CHAIRMAN AND ADMINISTRATION REMARKS FROM THE MARCH BOG MEETING:

Chairman's Remarks

Vice Chairman Mantucca expressed appreciations for the medical center's frontline staffers and all involved in maintaining a work environment centered on safety while continuing to deliver patient care services.

Administration (Hospital Leadership)

Administrator Dougherty declared that the medical center's focus is to ensure that we continue to operate safely and doing all that we can to minimize the financial impact to our employees due to the COVID-19 instituted measures.

The Medical Center's overarching YTD February 2020 scorecard was reviewed and discussed.

Administrator Dougherty highlighted that through February 29 we exceeded our targeted goals in our primary key performance indicators. It was highlighted that the 2020 strategies for growth continues to be our focus. We are continuing ongoing talks with CHLA and major IPAs within S. Calif. It was mentioned that with operations being impacted by the current COVID-19 crisis --- all our performance indicators will be negatively impacted over the next few months.

Chief of Staff and DPCS briefs focused on COVID-19 safety measures instituted; Performance Improvement initiatives and Academic activities being slowed in response to the current crisis affecting all travels.

DFS commented that we are experiencing an unfavorable reporting period; however, our Payor mix and Philanthropy are improving.

Tijuana Clinic Report (Reported by Patricia Siqueiros)

The Tijuana Clinic volumes report was reviewed and discussed. It was also mentioned that the clinic is restricted to scheduling post-ops, casting and emergency surgeries. An update was given as to other COVID-19 instituted measures, including screening all entrants to their floor (including non-Shriners patients/patients families).
