During the recent Helldorado Parade a couple of issues came up which need to be addressed. The first is who may operate a vehicle in the parade. The following is an extract from the Shriners International Bylaws:

(b) **Civic Parades.** In civic parades, and non-Shrine public appearances, Nobles, their spouses, and their children, and Masonic related or sponsored organizations, may participate, with the approval of the Potentate. Only Nobles may perform, compete, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels or operate any vehicle while parading.

Amend. 2021

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of (a) and (b) above, in those situations where a specific license is required by a state, due to the size, weight or passenger carrying capacity of a vehicle to be used in a parade, and should there be no member Noble properly licensed to operate said vehicle, the temple may hire a properly licensed driver with proof of proper insurance required, and verify that the driver has an acceptable driving record according to any applicable insurance carrier(s). This driver must be added to the insurance policy, and accepted by the insurance company, prior to his/her operating any vehicle on behalf of the temple.

Therefore, in accordance with paragraph (b) above only Nobles may “operate any vehicle while parading” unless there are special circumstances as covered under paragraph (c). Additionally, our insurance requires drivers to be added to the insurance policy prior to being covered by the insurance policy.

The other issue deals with controlling and maintaining control of parade vehicles. First, when starting a vehicle (mini car) ensure that the brake is set, and the vehicle is in neutral. One of our drivers started his vehicle and then had to chase the vehicle. Luckily, this issue did not result in damage or injury to either the driver, mini car, or any other property. The second incident, however, resulted in damage to a POV. A driver started his mini car and then walked away from the vehicle. The vehicle brake released, and the vehicle engaged and ran into the back of a POV causing damage to the POV. The POV was being driven in the parade by another Noble. Our insurance and Zelzah Shriners will now have to pay for the repairs of the POV. Accidents do happen, but we should be taking all the necessary precautions to limit those potential incidents. Both of these incidents could have been avoided if proper precautions had been taken. Making sure the brake is set and the vehicle is in neutral and not leaving a running car unattended.

Lets make sure that we are being safe and if you observe an unsafe activity, please say something so we can enjoy the parades and activities we participate in as an organization, unit, or club.
