Without missing a beat, Shriners stepped in and continued her care until she reached 21 years old and her reconstruction surgeries had completed.

Providing everything necessary, even transportation and lodging. This care began 20 years ago.

And might I add we experienced the most excellent care, and extremely professional handling, also the best state of the art medical services available.

Today she looks like a model she is so beautiful. You wouldn't know she had so many facial surgeries.

And the greatest part is, when this first began I planted the seed to return the love-she has and does everyday.

She is now a nurse.

Not just any nurse. She has a BSN and delivers babies at the Labor & Delivery department in Centennial Hospital Las Vegas. She paid her own way through school.

She guides new mothers who give birth, especially ones who deal with birth defects. When seeing the results of her journey it calms them about what their child's future can be.

And in the case of cleft lips and palettes she is a walking example of a wonderful future on a myriad of levels.

Also an advertisement of how Shriners is so helpful and needed.

Oh, her supervisor, the head nurse, just happened to be the nurse/midwife that delivered Lara 38 years ago at Women's Hospital and Contacted Dr. William Khopf to start her journey in reconstructive surgery and the amazing Shriners organization, staff and members, talk about kismet.

Anyway, Lara is a home grown Las Vegas Shriners Success Story of such great and admirable history/background.

Would be a shame to not let only the local area of Las Vegas know about her and her awesome journey but the nation during the time of the golf open to display Shriners great works! Shriners made it possible! And what a wonderful donation-investment. She is

giving back to the community that took such good care of her needs!



Each Shrine Temple needs and requires capable, high-type leadership. The normal starting point of that leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the Office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naïve or presumptuous as to believe that any one Noble could possibly embody all of the virtues, talents, and qualifications which are outlined in this checklist. Nevertheless, the list has practical value for self-evaluation by the Noble whose ultimate aspiration is the Office of Illustrious Potentate, and for evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

Every Noble is not fit to meet the rigorous demands placed upon Potentates.
